Henry Stoddard

The defendant who was arrested under the writ of Habeas Corpus awarded against him this day appeared in discharge of his recognizance. And being fully heard it was ordered by the Court that he be discharged from custody.

The last Will and Testament of Henry Stoddard deceased, was proved by the oaths of John A. Snow and William A. Barrett the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. William A. Barrett and David Stoddard two of the executors therein named appeared in Court and requested to take upon themselves the execution of the said will with the residue of Edward Stoddard the said Henry Stoddard therein named who made said will together James H. Parker and William J. Stoddard his devisees interests into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the last devise and legate required them for obtaining a Probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that John C. Jarvis, William A. Barrett, Edward C. Snow and John A. Snow among those of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace do appraise all the personal and real estate of Henry Stoddard dec'd. which may be to them presented or shown and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Perennial S. Whitfield having obtained an attachment against the estate of George Whitfield for twenty dollars fully eight cents with interest from the 24th day of October 1861 due by said George to a credit of said estate and order made thereon in the 7th October 1862, and the Court being made return that he had attached so much of the supposed amount due with pay the which amounted to twenty two dollars 75^{cs} with interest thereon from February 28th 1862 till paid as well as the costs incurred by serving this writ. And of the said estate the Justice returned George Whitfield in the hands of the said Thomas D. Merrill as administrator of James Henry dec'd. as by the return is more explicitly and have obtained the said Thomas D. Merrill to appear before the next Court to be held for Southampton County to declare what effects the husband has hands belonging to the said George Whitfield is how much he is indebted to him. This day causes the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant not appearing Thomas D. Merrill administrator of James Henry the guardian appeared and being sworn and examined. It is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said George Whitfield the sum of twenty dollars fully eight cents with interest thereon from 24th day of October 1861 till paid subject to a credit of 24th day of October 1862 and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that Thomas D. Merrill administrator as aforesaid do not of any sums which may hereafter come to his hands belonging to the said George Whitfield apply the same or as much thereof as may be sufficient to pay this judgment to the plaintiff.
