thus done. The said road has been opened by G. Griffin as proposed in said order. We find in
new road in a profitable and good condition and believe it will make an excellent road. all of
which is truly Subscribed. Given under our hands 30 - April 15 1824. Blaylock Lure &
W. Davis Attesting Deed". Whereupon it is ordered that the said road so opened be record and
established as a public highway and that the old road be discontinued.
