Bump, became the purchase for the sum of four hundred and thirty dollars the expenses and charges amount to \$22-12 cents deduct this sum from \$370-00 will leave the sum of \$447-88 cents that out of this sum I have taken one fourth part as a bond for Mary Susan Bump another fourth part as a bond for Kelly Sumner one of said sum one fourth part as another bond to A. B. Bump in right of her wife and the other fourth part as a bond to John B. Sniffin against one of W. B. Sniffin by his first wife Mary and have made a deed to the purchase made aforesaid according to order my hand this 12 day of April 1864
