This cause came on this day to be an air heard upon the papers formerly read together with the report of the Commissioner made at the last term to which no objection had been filed and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said report be held true and valid and binding between the parties -

On the motion of Samuel Dunning who presented the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law a decree is granted him to keep persons interested in this cause in this County till the next term.

On the motion of David Huggard. Ordered that John S. Morris who whereby appointed Special Commissioner for this purpose State, settle and report an additional account of David Huggard's administration as John S. Huggard's estate and make report to the Court.

Ordered that the estate of James S. Morris do be committed to the hands of Samuel D. Stone Esq. of this County for administration according to Law.

An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Elizabeth Storer do was returned and ordered to be recorded.

On motion and for reasons appearing to the Court Alfred S. Stephenson is appointed Executor in the room of William S. Stephenson in a certain debt of bond carried on the 27th day of October 1822 by John Morris to W. S. Stephenson for the benefit of Allen Stephenson and recorded in the Clerk's Office of this Court on the 27th of October 1823 - with as full power as is stated in the said W. S. Stephenson by the aforesaid debt of bond.

On motion and for reasons appearing to the Court Alfred S. Stephenson is appointed Executor in the room of John Sumner in a certain debt of bond carried on the 19th day of May 1823 by John Morris to the said John Sumner for the benefit of John V. Huggard and recorded in the Clerk's Office of this Court on the 2nd day of June 1823 with as full power as is stated in the said Sumner by the aforesaid debt of bond.

On the petition of William D. Stock administrator of Benjamin H. Hancock dec'd Pollock B. Raulings, Harriaduke H. Hancock and John A. Bell and for reasons appearing to the Court the Court doth appoint Edward D. Wells Executor in the room of the latter in a certain debt of bond carried on the 26th day of January 1821 and recorded in the Clerk's Office of this Court by John A. D. Stock to the said John A. D. Stock for the benefit of the said W. D. Stock, as executor of the said H. Hancock, Harriaduke H. Hancock and John A. Bell and that the said Wells have the same power and authority as is stated in the said John A. D. Stock by the said debt of bond.

On the motion of Edmund S. Whitfield. Ordered that Andrew Thompson Esq. settle and report an additional account of the said Whitfield's administration as Henry Thompson's estate and make report thereof to the Court with any matter specially stated deemed particularly proper or which he may be required to state.
