Ordered that the proper sheriff be caused to send a sufficient sum day presented by the grand
jury returned here to the first day of the next quarterly term.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that Jacob's slave belonging to Patrick Boundary (formerly belonging to Joseph Rogers) be ransomed by the owners of the field of this County on this present -

On the motion of Nancy Bowles administrator of Samuel E. Bowles late. Ordered that
William M. Davis who is timely appointed Special Commissioner for the principal slave debt and
adjust an account of said Nancy Bowles administration in his intestate estate and make report
to the Court.

On the motion of Horace D. Moreham administrator of Matthew Vick etc. Ordered that Major
Commissioner Cobb examine slaves and debts an account of the said Vick's grandfather of Sally
Vick (now Sally Darden) and report the same to the Court with any results specially stated.
Deemed preferable by himself or which may be required to that.

John Moreham having obtained an attachment against the estate of Robert Edwards when the
said Moreham desists to remove his effects for Forty nine dollars twenty 4/5 cents due by
account. And the Plaintiff having made return that he had removed the said attachment on 22
July past, judgment, 1. Sixty and twelve 2. Forty 1. One cent Eastward, some hilles and Cottages,
2. Cloth worth 1. One 3. Four of hilles, of dwelling machine, 1. Small barrel, and that he has recovered
George W. Holland for 2.50 & Charles Holland for 18.50. That the Court the Plaintiff by his attorney
and the defendant not appearing. It is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff comes against the defendant
the sum of forty nine dollars twenty 4/5 cents and his rate by time on this behalf suspended. But
it is ordered that the Plaintiff make due of the attached effects forward and apply the proceeds
thereof towards satisfying this judgment and that George W. Holland one of the jointers pay to the
Plaintiff two dollars fifty cents and that Charles Holland another garnisher pay the sum of sixteen
dollars, the amounts respectively due from them to the defendant in part satisfaction of the judgment
and that Robert Edwards author of the judgment be summoned to the next Court to declare on
what account is due from him to the defendant. And that the Sheriff return an account of
the sale of reward to the Court.
