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This day this cause was dictated by law of Court and read out of Court and came in to be
 read on the Bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth
 direct and decree that Edwin Vaughan be appointed Special Commissioner of the Court
 that he after due notice of time and place of sale sell on a writ of execution the land and apparently
 held by Sally Woodard as donee in the estate of her husband John Woodard and that he take
 bids at publick after deducting the costs of this sale which he is required to incur in case on the day
 of sale lands for the real estate he is to take down loads and appear to William Howell and
 Henry his wife, wife Josephine, executors of Joseph S. Cloud, wife Alice Penman and others his
 wife, wife Edwin Vaughan, administrator of Samuel Woodard do^r, vis to William D. Clarke trustee
 for Daniel Pitts, and to the heirs of Edwin Woodard and the heirs to the land of John Woodard.
 For the personally he is also to take down loads and appear to Jack Davis, assignee of Benjamin Howell
 and to Joseph Abromice, executor of Joseph S. Cloud who was assignee of Shirley Woodard, and to Sampson
 Rogers, administrator of Samuel Woodard, and to William D. Clarke trustee for Daniel Pitts, and to
 Nelly & Lawrence, William D. Whitehead, assignee of Edwin Woodard, and the heirs to the administrato-
 ror of John Woodard do^r, and about his proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Thomas Vaughan for leave to speak a word from James Rufus to General
 Vaughan. The Commissioner having been appointed to view the way for opening said road this day made report
 which report is in these words tenth. We the Commissioners appointed by the within order have viewed the
 ground for the proposed road and report that it will be convenient to the publick which is especially directed
 to the Court, April 19th 1844. Robt. Howell, John Moore Jr., Washington after considering said report and
 all circumstances being weighed, it is ordered that Vaughan have leave to speak first and as proposed.

Ordered that the bounds of Shirley Hedge do run on the road of which Horatio D. Williams is
 the Surveyor.

The Commissioners appointed to let the report of the Bridge over the head of Davis' mill found
 the day made report which report is confirmed & ordered to be recorded and is in these words tenth
 Subsequent to the within, a copy of an order of the Court, 25th June 1844, Mr Jonathan Parker
 and Jacob Davis at auction proceeded and did let to the lowest bidder the report of the within
 named bridge, and it so turned out that Jacob Davis one of us was the underbidder of the same being
 at twenty dollars, which sum is completed agreeable to contract. Given under my hand this 19th day
 August 1844. Jonathan Parker Comr.

The Commissioners appointed to let the report of the Carpenter and Village bridge this day made
 report which is confirmed and ordered to be recorded, and is in these words tenth. We the undersigned
 Commissioners appointed by the Court to let the report of the Carpenter Village bridge, our report that
 the same has been completed by John D. Williams the contractor, and the Court shall allow the
 sum to be paid out of the contingent fund, as the amount for which the said work was undertaken and
 appointed when the day was fixed. Respectfully submitted. Jas. Bell, Robt. Henry, Jonathan.

Ordered that the Sheriff pay John D. Williams the sum laid at your Court bill for payment on the Village
 and Carpenter bridge.
