This day the cause was debated by leave of Court and record of finding and came in to be
heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth
order adjournment and decree that Owen Roygart be appointed Special Commissioner of the Court
that he after due notice of time and place of sale sell on a credit of three months the land and appurtenances
held by Betty Woodard as dower in the estate of her husband John Woodard; and that he take
lands as follows after deducting the costs of this decree which he is required to incur in each on the day
of sale thereof for the real estate he is to take seven loads and assign one to Benjamin Woodell and
Mary his wife, one to Joseph Parice executor of Joseph D. Woodard, one to John Sumner and Mary his
wife, one to Owen Roygart administrator of Samuel Woodard dec'd, one to William D. Clarke executor
for Daniel Wells, one to the heirs of Samuel Woodard and the other to the heirs of Joseph Woodard.
For the personally he is also to take seven loads and assign one to David Quinn - assign of Benjamin Woodell
executor of Joseph Woodard who was assign of William Woodard, one to Joseph Quinn
executor of Joseph Woodard who was assign of William Woodard, one to William D. Clarke executor for Daniel Wells, one to
Nathaniel Lawrence & William D. Woodard assign of Samuel Woodard, and the other to the administra-
tor of Joseph Woodard dec'd and report his proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Thomas Vaughan petition to have a new road from Sumner House to Drans
Vaughans. The Commissioners therefore appointed to view the way for paving said road this day made report
which report is in these words to wit. We the Commissioners appointed by the within order have viewed the
ground for the proposed road and report that it will be convenient to the public which is especially desired
to the Court. April 19th 1846. Robt. Marshall John Moore for Vaughan after viewing said report and
all circumstances being weighed, it is ordered that Vaughan have leave to open said road as proposed.

Ordered that the bounds of Hating Ridge do not on the ground of which Thomas D. Williams is
the party.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of the Bridge across the head of Paines well found
this day made report which report is in these words to wit. We the Commissioners appointed
by the within order, a copy of an order of the Court dated June 1846, for Jonathan Darden
and Jacob Parice at auction proceeded and did let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the within
named bridge and it is turned out that Jacob Parice one of us was the undertaker of the repairs thereof
at twenty dollars, which work is completed agreeable to contract. Given under my hand this 19th day
August 1846. Jonathan Darden Comr.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of the Crossman and Village bridges this day made
report which report is in these words to wit. We the Commissioners appointed by the Court to let the repairs of the Crossman Village bridges now report that
the same has been completed by John A. Williams the undertaker, and the Court should allow the
same to be paid out of the contingent fund, as the amount for which the said work and materials was

Ordered that the Sheriff pay John Williams the sum laid at June Court last for repairs to the Village
and Crossman bridges.
