The Commissioner appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause at May Term last to make out of the slaves held by Mary A. Kirby "at least so long as under her care or under the care of John Day etc" this day made a report which is in these words "According to a bill presented by the County Court of Northampton 28th May 1824 in the suit of William Rockville vs. Miles R. Hatchard et al. against William R. Hatchard owner of Mary A. Kirby, Esq. I have after advertising according to the terms of such decree the slaves therein mentioned sold the same as directed - Slave pair etc taken into account and reported the same to the Court - I made a statement as a part of this report -

The Commissioner appointed by the interlocutory decree hereinbefore rendered in this cause to divide the real and personal estate of George Whitfield dft. this day made a report which is in these words "According to the written order of the Honorable Court of Southampton County to be divided. As the undivided Commissioner is satisfied in said order, he has divided the tract of land of which George Whitfield die possessed known as the Spring ground tract of land containing eighty nine acres, into three parts of equal value, as represented in the said accompanying bill report in the following manner to wit.
