During said year drawn by Martha Whitfield and bounded by the lands of said Lewis Morris while by the due law of Oct 1st 1745 by the land of said Barnes and by the path road between lots No 2 & 3. Lot No 3 containing forty six & 1/2 acres known by the name of Newfield & 1/2 acre field and bounded by the back path road at lot No 2 and the land of Lewis Morris estate and the land of Jacob Barnes. Morris also divided the personal estate of said George Whitfield, valued at thirty seven dollars and fifty cents, into three equal lots or shares as follows:

Lot No 1 Drawn by Martha Whitfield containing the following articles - A Bed \$10 1/2

Yards 50 ft. 1 chest \$25 - 1 chair.

1 Wheel 100 ft. Bed 10 ft. 1 table 25 ft. 1 chamber 25 ft.

1 round box, 1 tray 1 stand.

Lot No 2 drawn by Margaret Whitfield containing the following articles -

1 round box, 1 tray 1 stand.

Lot No 3 Drawn by Norfolk W. Whitfield containing the following articles -

1 Bed, chais & Cradle 17 25

1 Wheel 12 ft. Chair 4 ft. 22. Scales of weight 55 ft.

1 pot 100 ft. 1 Harbor candlestick York 15 ft.

All of which is respectfully submitted to the court. Given under our hands the 27th day of Sept 1842. At B. Howell, Soc. Barnes, & Myrick.

James B. Colwell who hath ^{been} appointed Sheriff of this County by a Commission from the Executive Governor, acting in the absence of the Governor from the seat of Government, and the seal of the Commonwealth annexed dated the 24th day of September 1842. Doth this day together with N. H. Colwell and Nathaniel J. Williams his deputies, caused oaths and acknowledgments to be made of the sum of Ten thousand dollars conditioned according to Law, which sum is ordered to be recorded. The said Colwell took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath against dethroning and the oath of office.

The last Will and Testament of Brian Adams do['] witness by the oaths of Lewis Morris and David Power the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Thomas M. Newson the exequat thereon named Alexander Colwell and together with David Barnes and Lewis Morris his deputies caused oaths and acknowledged above in the sum of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificates is granted him for claiming a part of the said Will as heretofore.

I witness I take cognizance for John G. Turner having obtained an attachment against the estate of Adam Hildie who is removing out of the County generally for Twenty dollars with interest from the 15th day of December 1842, also the further sum of \$1000 the sum by account and the counterfoile having made return that he has levied the sum attached in 55 bushels of Corn & 5 bushels of Peas & 2 bushels of Turnips per bushel. This day cause the plaintiff by his attorney and for reasons appearing to the Court this said attachment is continued till the next term.

An account current and summary general report of David R. Newson administrator on Thomas M. Newson estate was returned and ordered to lie on Term for inspection.
