six hundred pounds conditioned as thidate debts certificable is granted him for obtaining
letters of administration on the estate of Peter Pope sic in due form.

On the motion of Richard A. Ueglehardt who made oath and together with James L. Ueglehardt his son-in-law, and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of George B. Hiltman do in due form.

The Court doth adjn'g Alfred T. Stephenson, questioner to John A. Lawrence, agent of Lewis & Lawrence, die, and thereupon the said Alfred T. Stephenson with Allen Stephenson and James H. Jenkins his percutor entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of one thousand dollars conditioned according to law -

The Court also allows Stephen's guardian to Elizabeth & Summerville \$1000 & Summerville to the said Alton Stephen together with interest from and Alfred J. Stephen's his beneficiary's cultural note and acknowledged a bond in the amount of ten thousand dollars confirmed according to law.

formed by the oath of Copeland, Isaac, Edwin Bradburn and Miles Drachman the subscriber
witness thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Robert C. Griffis one of the
executors therin named who made said will and together with Edwards Bulle and Miles Cook
have been sworn before me and acknowledged a bond in the sum of ten thousand
dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a copy of
the said will as due form, liberty being reserved for the other executors to be joined in it
and perfect when he thinks fit.
