affidavit it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the amount
sum of £100⁰⁰ due and owing to be paid and his costs to have this debt expended. And it
is ordered that the Sheriff make sale of the attached effects aforesaid according to law and
out of the moneys arising from said sale first pay and satisfy a prior judgment this day
rendered against the said Joseph Row in favour of Dr C W P Pope, then apply the balance
if any, or so much thereof as is necessary to the payment of this judgment and reduce the surplus
of any to the defendant. And return an account of said sale to Court.

first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do apprise all the personal
estate of Nancy Edwards dec'd and return the apprisement under their hands to Court -
