Ordered that the account of William R. Edwards Clerk according to seven dollars be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.

This day this cause was docketed by consent of parties and with the assent of the Court and came on to be heard on the bill and answer, and was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court with advice, order and decree that Robert B. This day this cause came on to be heard, with leave of Court and consent of parties and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court with advice, order and decree that James M.
