neglected, were returned and satisfied to be truly made.

For reasons appearing to the Court, it is ordered that the Devisors of the Poor land New Court  
and Ephraim and Robert free men be to George Brown, according to law, and that the  
said Brown pay for the services of the said Devisors as follows: for New Courtlands ten dollars  
annually, for Ephraim seven dollars annually and for Robert ten dollars annually, which sum  
are to be paid to the Devisors of the Poor except for the last year, after which time it is to be  
paid to the Devisors respectively.

Ordered that the account of Samuel B. Davis, Sheriff amounting to \$135.00 be satisfied to  
the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

The Court are unanimously in recommending Samuel B. Davis, William Bridges and David Brown  
Court, to the Governor of this Commonwealth as fit and proper persons to execute the Office of Judge  
of this County the ensuing year.

This day the cause was docketed, and by consent came on to be heard on the 11th, answer upon  
two points and exhibit and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court with advice  
order and decree that William J. Roberts Thomas A. Porter, Robert Dicks and John Davis among  
three of whom may act, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, do after giving  
twenty days notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement at three or more public places  
in the neighborhood of the land, sell on the premises to the highest bidder, or a credit of twelve  
months, except cash different to pay the interest of sale, and of this kind, the land of which  
David Williams had died, having from the proceeds three lands of equal amount and  
good twenty that they assign one of said lands to Rebecca Bridges, one to Charles Williams and  
to Matthew Williams, Jones & Day then Hancock to be paid to their legally qualified guardian -  
that the Commissioners make report on or before a final decree.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
