

The Commissioners appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause at August term last this day made their report, which is in these words to wit: "By virtue of a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date August Court 1864 which is here annexed, we the undersigned Commissioners have according to said decree attended by the County Surveyor divided the land of Charles Summers described as follows to wit: Pt. At. 1 to Mary G. Summers containing thirty acres, Pt. At. 2 to Charles Ashdown containing seventeen acres, Pt. At. 3 to William D. Ashdown alias of Benjamin James Young his wife containing thirteen acres, Pt. At. 4 to Samuel Sumner containing twenty five acres, At. At. 5 to William Summers containing twenty four acres, At. At. 6 to Darling H. Lemer & Sally O. his wife containing twenty four acres, At. At. 7 to John Summers containing twenty four acres which will more fully appear by reference to the plan hereto annexed: All of which is respectfully submitted to the Court. William J. Debelle, Esq. Justice Commissioner."
