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On the motion of James Barnes. Ordered that Alexander Myrick, Thomas B. Wardell and Jacob Barnes or any two of them who are hereby appointed, Special Commissioners for this purpose, state, settle and adjust an account of the said Barnes transactions in the estate of Burwell Crockett dec^d and make report thereof to Court.

On motion of Martha Vaughans administratrix of Anthony Vaughans dec^d. Ordered that Williams B. Shanks one of the Commissioners of this Court, settle the account of the said Martha Vaughans administratrix on her intestates estate and make report thereof to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or advice to any by required to state.

Samuel Wells who has been appointed Commissioner of the Revenue for this County for the ensuing year, this day with John W. Burley has been duly entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On motion of William A. McFarland. Ordered that Meredith Holland administratrix of Victor Clay dec^d pay to the said William A. McFarland the sum of twenty dollars the amount of his account proved to be just.

A Writing bearing date October 19th 1846 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Clements Rockelle dec^d was this day produced in Court by William A. Sparks the executor therein named in order to be proved. Whereupon George W. Conner who intermarried with a daughter of the said Clements Rockelle appeared in Court and opposed the proof of the said writing. And thereupon William A. Sparks and James Mayes whose names are subscribed as witnesses to the said writing were sworn and examined and the parties by their Counsel fully heard. On consideration thereof it is the opinion of the Court that the Clements Rockelle deceased at the time of executing this aforesaid writing was of sound mind and disposing mind and memory and that he was under no undue influence and that the said writing was duly attested according to law. Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Clements Rockelle dec^d. And on the motion of William A. Sparks the Executor therein named who made and together with John W. Burley, Nathaniel S. Williams and James B. McFarland has been duly entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificates be granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that James Mayes, Henry Blom, Alexander Myrick, Thomas B. Wardell, Davis Bryant and Jacob Bennett or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Clements Rockelle dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
