confessed as to those defendants. And therefore the cause come on to be heard on the 1st  
answer of the other defendant and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the  
Court doth adjudge order and direct that George A. W. Newson who is appointed a  
Commissioner for the purpose sell the slaves held by Ann Brown during her life in  
the will of her deceased husband Robert Nickelson on a credit of six months (except  
cash sufficient to pay the expenses of this suit and of the sale) that he take bids of  
the purchaser so as to make five equal amounts that he pay over one fifth to George  
P. Nickelson administrator of Jane his deceased wife one fifth to Lucy A. Nickelson  
infant of Robert Nickelson that the Commissioner retain one fifth in his own right as  
purchase from Albert H. Nickelson that the remaining three fifths be retained to him  
for the future order for the benefit of John T. Blaw and Sally his wife and Lucy  
Nickelson. The Commissioner is required to report to Court in order to a final decree.

one third in value of the real estate of her deceased husband to be held by her for her  
service that they sell the slaves of which Sife Hart died possessed on a credit of twelve  
months except cash sufficient to defray expenses of said sale and sell one half of  
the purchase to Jane Hart in trust of her third and the balance equally divide between  
Lucy and Levi Hart children of Sife. The commissioners will report to Court in  
order to a final decree.

said Harris as guardian to Elegay W. R. Maget and make report to this Court in order  
to a final decree.
