It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the plaintiffs have proceeded in the manner
permitted by law against absent defendants against the defendants John T. Pilon and Sally his
wife and George Nicholas who still failing to appear and answer the bill is taken for
confessed as to these defendants. And thereupon the cause came on to be heard on the bill
answer of the other defendants and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the
Court doth adjudge order and decree that George A W Newsum (who is appointed) as
Commissioner for the purposes sell the slaves held by Ann Brown during her life under
the will of her deceased husband Robert Nicholas on a credit of six months (except
cash sufficient to pay the expenses of this suit and of the sale) that he take bonds of
the purchaser so as to make five equal annuities - that he pay out one fifth to Bernard
P. Nicholas administrator of Jane his deceased wife - one fifth to Lucy A. Nicholas
infant of Robert Nicholas - that the Commissioner retain one fifth in his own right as
purchaser from Albert W. Nicholas - that the remaining two fifths be retained to bank
for the future order for the benefit of John T. Pilon and Sally his wife and George
Nicholas - the Commissioner is required to report to Court in order to a final decree

This day this cause was docketed by consent of parties and came on to be heard on the
bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth
adjudge order and decree that Allen Stephenson, Jesse Canale and Henry Paul be
appointed Commissioners who are required to allot to Jane Hart widow of Jesse Hart
one third in value of the real estate of her deceased husband to be held by her for life
her dower - that they sell the slaves of which Jesse Hart died possessed on a credit of twelve
months - except cash sufficient to defray expenses of suit & sale - and allot one sixth of
the purchase to Jane Hart in lieu of her thirds and the balance equally divide between
Lucy and Levi Hart children of Jesse - The Commissioners will report to Court in
order to a final decree -

negro slaves owned by Wiley Francis to Edwidge C. Magot, Samuel W. and Eleazer W. R. Magot,
into three parts of equal value and allot one part to Edwidge C. Magot, one part to
Samuel W. as guardian to Samuel W. Magot - and the remaining third part to
paid Harris as guardian to Eleazer W. R. Magot - and make report to this Court in order
to a final decree -
