 This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties with the assent of the Court and cause to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that William D Goodwyn, William Prince, Thomas S Reddy and James C Jones are hereby appointed Commissioners for that purpose (or any three of them) do divide the negro slaves in the bill mentioned into ten equal portions and allot one tenth to Nancy Holt, one tenth to Richard D Drury in right of his wife Fanny - one to Humphrey Drury, one to Edmund Drury, one to Samuel Drury - one to John Drury, one to James Drury one to the children of Susan Jones, one fourth of one tenth to Francis H Drury infant of Joseph Drury dec. and the remaining one tenth to his grand-children, children of Francis S Redman. And the Court doth further decree that the Commissioners, all to Samuel Drury and John Drury the parties of Francis H Drury) and the children of Francis S Redman to be held by them for the purposes directed by the testator. And how they shall have proceeded in the premises make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

On motion this cause was this day docketed and by consent of parties, cause to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth order, adjudge and decree that Benjamin S Drew, Arthur W Holleman, John D Oyster and William C Edwards any three of whom may act, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for that purpose, do provide giving five days notice of the time and place of division as hereafter to be made, to set apart, assign and allot, by sales and bonds, having regard to quantity and quality. One third part of all the lands whereof the said George Holleman dec. was seized in death or in law, at the time of his death or during his lifetime (with said wife Fanny C Holleman, to which her right of dower is barred by relinquishment or otherwise) unto the said Francis C Holleman the widow of the said George as her dower lands. And if there be more than one tract, the said Commissioners of the intent of all parties would be promoted by so doing, assign and allot an entire tract or tracts, to the said widow as her dower, and compensation for the difference be made to effect an equality upon basis of equity and justice and upon the principles herein before set forth: And the said Commissioners or any three of them, do further proceed to assign, allot and transfer, unto the said Fanny C Holleman widow of said George Holleman, one third part, regard being had to value of One third of the negroes slaves whereof the said George Holleman dec. possessed, as her the said Fanny Holleman owns or thirds of said slaves, and the other two thirds of said slaves assign and transfer to the legal qualified guardian of George A Holleman the infant son and heir at law of said George Holleman dec. And report proceedings of said division and allotment of dower and thirds to the Court in order to a final decree in the premises.
