This cause was this day dictated by counsel of parties with the assent of the court and was to be tried on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that William & Godfrey, William Price, Francis & Adolphus, James & Peter are hereby appointed Commissioners for that purpose (or any three of them) to divide the negro slaves in the bill mentioned into ten equal portions and allot one tenth to Nancy Holt, daughter to Richard & Brigg in right of his wife Peggy - one to Humphrey Drury, one to Edward Drury, one to Samuel Drury - one to John Drury, one to James Drury one to the children of Susan Drury, one fourth of sole tenth to Francis & Drury infant of Joseph Drury Esq^r and the remaining one tenth to his grand-children children of Francis & Adolphus. And the Court doth further decree that the Commissioners allot to Samuel Drury and John Drury the portions of Francis & Drury and the children of Francis & Adolphus to be held by them for the purposes directed by the testator. And how they shall have proceeded in the premises make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

George A Holloman infant of George Holloman dec^d by Deborah R Edwards his guardian ad litem & Richard A Vaughan attorney of George Holloman dec^d Deft.

On account this cause was this day dictated and by counsel of parties, came as to be tried on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth order and decree that Benjamin J Brown, Arthur W Holloman, Israel Cope and William A Russell any three of whom may act, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for such purpose, do proceed to give five days notice of the time and place of division as hereafter to be made, to all aforesaid a sign and allot, by notice and bonds, having regard to quantity and quality. One third part of all the lands whereof the said George Holloman dec^d was seized in fee simple or in law, at the time of his death or during continuall (with said wife Fanny E Holloman, to whom he left of dower not bound by relinquishment or otherwise) unto the said Francis E Holloman the widow of the said George as his dower lands. And if there be more than one tract, the said Commissioners of the whole of all parties would be permitted by so doing, a sign and allot an entire tract or tract, to the said widow as her dower, and compensation for the difference to be made to effect an equally upon law of equity and justice and upon the principles herein before set forth. And the said Commissioners or any three of them, so further specified to a sign, allot and transfer, unto the said Fanny E Holloman widow of said George Holloman, one third part regard being had to value of one third of the negro slaves whereof the said George Holloman dec^d possessed, as her the said Fanny Holloman done or thirds of such slaves, and the other two thirds of such slaves apportioned and transferred to the legal qualified guardian of George A Holloman the infant son and heir at law of said George Holloman dec^d. And report proceedings of said division and allotment of dower and thirds to the Court in order to a final decree in the premises.
