The Commissioners in this cause this day made the following report. Testis. "Agreeable to an  
order of Southampton November Court 1854, vs. John Vick, Robert G. Griffin and William  
Atkins did value and allow to Mary Harris widow of John Harris what dover in the lands  
of said John Harris one third part in value, that is to say, forty five acres with the  
house and orchard valued at three hundred dollars, and bounded as follows, on the south  
west by William Atkins' land, on the North by the mill pond of said Atkins, on the N.W.  
by the gravelly soil to a white oak, between newly made between the trees and widow,  
N. West, thence a line of 70 rods, to a black gum in said Atkins line. The  
widow also is granted the privilege of getting rail timber on any part of the children's  
land where most convenient, to keep up the fence or said dover. All of which is submitted  
to the Court. Dated under our hands this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1855. John Vick, R. G.  
Griffin, William Atkins commissioners".

This day this cause was dictated by leave of the Court and consent of parties, and came  
on to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof  
the Court did order, adjudge and decree that Sam'l Bryant be appointed Commissioner,  
that he attend by a competent surveyor, allow to the widow for life, one third of the lands which  
Sam'l B. Woodard died seized and possessed, also allow to her one half of the negro slaves  
(regards being had to value), for life - that said Commissioner sell to the highest bidder,  
after advertising the time and place of sale for twenty days the remainder of said land  
and slaves before the following term Court. The lands upon record of nine hundred, the  
slaves for each, and that the funds be disposed of as follows, after paying the cost of the
