This day this cause was docketed by leave of Court and counsel of parties and came to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that James Harris be appointed trustee to the same, receive articles entered into by Timothy T. Washburn and his late wife, and that he be clothed with full power to act under said deed - And the Court doth further, order, adjudge and decree that said trustee be authorized to sell one of the slaves embraced in said trust, and out of the proceeds arising from said sale, satisfy and pay to Ridley & Goodenough twenty dollars for professional services rendered - also pay to T. H. D. Drury eight four dollars bond costs with interest from 20th November 1850, subject to a credit of fourteen dollars paid March 16th 1852, also to T. H. D. Drury \$5.00 per. also pay to Samuel Drury twenty five dollars bond costs for several expenses - also to same \$5.00 per. due by note, that he further satisfy the costs of this decree, and report to the Court in order to a final decree.

Richard Parker who hath been appointed Constable in this County in the room of Samuel D. Moore resigned this day appeared in Court and took the several oaths prescribed by law, and together with Jesse Parker and Edwin Harrison his kinsmen entered into a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law, which bond was acknowledged by the Magistrate therein named and ordered to be recorded. It appearing to the Court that the said Parker is a man of honesty, probity and good demeanor.

On the motion of William D. Clarke Esq. The Court certifies that the said William D. Clarke Esq. is a man of good character and that their store is a place fit and convenient for the neighborhood in which it is situated for the retail of spirituous liquors. If.

Ordered that Sampson B. Rice, Benjamin C. Pope, Edwin Harris & Drury Defts. or any three of them, do let to the Court under seal the expense of Blauvelt bridge, repair the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.
