to the heirs of Daniel Woodsides same proportion. To John Woodsides heirs sum of proportion,  
and same to William B. Clarke's widow for creation of Daniel Wells. And report to Court  
in order to a final decree.

This day this cause was docketed by leave of Court and heard of parties and counselle  
between the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the  
Court doth adjudge, order and decree that James Harris be appointed trustee to the man-  
nage articles owned into by Timothy J. Blanchard and his late wife, and that he be  
clothed with full power to act under said deed. And the Court doth further, order,  
adjudge and decree that said trustee be authorized to sell one of the slaves contained in  
said trust and out of the money arising from said sale, satisfy and pay to Ridley & Readings  
attorneys twenty dollars for professional services rendered - Also pay to S. J. Drury eight  
four dollars twelve cents, withdrawn from 20<sup>th</sup> November 1860, subject to a credit of fourteen  
dollars paid March 16<sup>th</sup> 1862 - also to S. J. Drury \$5.67. Also pay to Samuel Drury  
Twenty five dollars sixty cents for services performed - Also to Drury \$5.67. due by who -  
that he further satisfy the rest of the decree, and report to the Court in order to a final decree.

Richard Parker who hath been appointed constable in this County in the room of Hamel  
D. Morris resign'd the day appounding last and took the several oaths prescribed by law, and  
together with Sife Parker and Edwin Garrison his associates entered into a bond in the  
sum of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law, which bond was acknowledged  
by the Mayor thereon signed and ordered to be recorded. It appearing to the Court that the  
said Parker is a man of honesty, probity and good character.

On the motion of William B. Clarke &c. The Court certified that the said William B.  
Clarke &c. are men of good character and that their store is a place fit and convenient for  
the neighbourhood in which it is situated for the trial of Apollos Higgins &c.

Ordered that Sampson & Reed, Benjamin C. Pope, Edwin Harris & Drury & Readings &  
any three of them, do to the lowest bidder take the expense of Blund bridge, repair  
the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.
