On the motion of Wells H. Clark the Court certifies that they are men of good character and that their store is a place fit and convenient for the neighborhood in which it is situated for the retail of ardent spirits &c.

Pettway counters of Henry Pettway dec^d in obedience to the order of Court made December Court last this day rendered to the Court the sum of \$97. in bonds in full of the tax of the slaves in the year 1824, held in trust for the benefit of the estate of Charles Smith Henry which bonds are accepted by the Court and ordered to be handed by the Clerk of this Court to Abraham Smith.

On the motion of Sarah Simmons widow of John Simmons dec^d Ordered that Samuel Little and wife Little attended by a competent lawyer or surveyor, do lay off and assign to the said widow one third in value of the land whereof her said husband died seized and possessed as her dower for life and make report thereof to Court.

On the motion of Henry Moore who made oath and gave bond and security according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of John Hammond dec^d in due form.

Ordered that John Whithead, Benjamin H. Waller, Nathaniel Jones and Joseph Little or any three of them, being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of John Hammond dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
