Def. In Chancery

This day this cause was heard by the Court and certain objections were  
made, or to be heard on the bill and answer, and was argued by counsel: The Court  
whereof the Court after order, adjudge and decree that Henry Moore be ap-  
pointed Commissioner of this Court, for the purpose of selling the mill known as
