The Commissioners in this cause this day made a report in the following words to wit: 'Agreeably to a decree of the County Court of Southampton dated July Court 1844. We do underigned two of the Commissioners appointed in said decree in obedience to the regulations thereof, being attended by Geo. B. Morrell as surveyor, have laid off the dower of Mrs. Edwin Underwood, in the land of her late husband Frederick Boykin dec^d there being in the whole land, by a former survey, ninety one acres, of which we have laid off twenty four acres for the dower, including the houses, by a line beginning at a post oak, a corner for said dower, in Josiah Morrells line, thence along a new line of marked trees N 10° W 120 poles to a dogwood standing in the North side of the Arrows branch thence at 75° E 42 poles to a small white oak, thence at 64° E 81 1/2 poles to a hickory, a corner for the said dower in Ethelred Smiths line, thence two lines to Fergusons line, thence along said Fergusons line to said Josiah Morrells line, thence two lines to the begⁿ.
