This day came the parties in their proper persons and by their consent it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant Bailey nine dollars sixty four cents with interest thereon from the 1st September 1854 to tell paid the debt and interest on the said judgment and his costs by him about his suit at this behalf expended. To be valued of the goods and chattels of the defendant in the hands of the defendant to be administered. And the said defendant in Money for this judgment is to be credits for thirty dollars paid January 12th 1852.

On the motion of John R Williams. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of Taxes and taxes in future being imposed.

Ordered that Seth D Williams, Jeff Parker and Merrills Holland do let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding of the bridge at old Southbury, remeasured same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

The Court proceeded to elect a Constable to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Nathan W. Bryant, and the vote of the Court being taken were as follows:
For Sephra Powell the votes were. A. M. Tabb, Govt Bowers, J. B. Nicholson, James Magat, Thomas W. Worrell, A. Myrick, G. W. Newell, Jacob Barrett, Henry Blair, Benj^e Cope, & J. Ridley.

For W. H. Bryant the votes were. A. J. Smith & James W. Bryant.
Sephra Powell having a majority of the whole number of votes was declared duly elected, it appearing to the Court that she said Powell is a man of honesty, probity & good character, and thereupon the said Powell took the several oaths prescribed by law and together with Lewis Worrell and Josiah Worrell has since been entered into a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond was acknowledged by the several signors thereto named and ordered to be recorded.

On motion of John Stearns Jr. Sheriff for Elizabeth Dugay for the guardianship of her infant children. Ordered that she be summoned to the next Court to give the said Stearns good counter-security according to law.

The registers of Lydia Atkis, Caroline Brown, James Grant, William Hunt, Nicholas Whitfield and Sumner Whitehead, four negroes, were examined and certified to be truly made.

On the motion of Samuel P. Hanes Sheriff of this County. James B. McFerney, William Parker, William B. Lillard, James McFerney, William A. Bell, and Benjamin W. Godfrey are permitted to qualify as his deputies during his pleasure, and therewith they severally take the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath prescribed by an act entitled "An act to amend an act intituled 'An act to support dwelling' the oath to support"
