It was found that the parties in their proper persons, and by their intent it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant Dally was dollars Dally four cents with interest thereon from the 25th September 1841 to full paid the debt and interest on the said instrument and his costs by him about his debt on this behalf expended. He be liable of the goods and chattels of the decedent in the hands of the defendant to be administered. And the said defendant pay Henry for this judgment is to be credited for thirty dollars paid January 12th 1842.

On the motion of John R. Williams. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and taxes in future he being injured.

Ordered that Seth D. Williams, Jesse Parker and Morrisette Holland do let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding of the bridge at old South-gate, repair the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

For W. R. Bryant the votes were. A. J. Smith & James D. Bryant 2.
Septima Powell having a majority of the whole number of votes was declared duly elected, it appearing to the Court that the said Powell is a man of honesty, soberly & good demeanor, and that upon the said Powell took the several oaths prescribed by law and together with Lewis Worrell and Josiah Worrell his sureties entered into a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond was acknowledged by the several obligors therein named and ordered to be recorded.

On motion of John Scarborough for security for Elizabeth Orpelt for the guardianship of her infant children. Ordered that she be summoned to the next Court to give the said Scarborough good countersecurity according to law.

The registers of Eliza Arbis, Caroline Brown, James Grant, William Hunt, Nicholas Whitfield and Timmons Whitfield, free negroes, were examined and satisfied to be truly made.

On the motion of Samuel D. House Sheriff of this County, James D. Wappling, William Parker, William D. Larrick, James Wappling, William A. Bell, and Benjamin W.
