This day came as well the attorney for the Commonwealth as the defendant by his
attorney and thereupon came a jury to wit: John Ellsworth, Henry Riddle, George
Gardner, Levi Huntley, James A. Merrill, Benjamin Davies, William A. Jones, John B.
Wells, Edwin Harrison, James Cloud, and William Vick who being elected tried and
sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oath returned a verdict to
the following words to wit: "We the jury find the defendant guilty and apply his fine
to one hundred dollars." Whereupon on the motion of the attorney for the Commonwealth
a writ of Capias is awarded against the defendant to be directed to the Sheriff of the
County, commanding him to take the said defendant if he be found within his bail and
and him safely keep so as to have him here on the first day of the next quarterly term
to show if any thing he hath to say, why the Court should not then proceed to put
judgment against him according to law.
