This day came as well the attorney for the Commonwealth as the defendant by his attorney and thereupon came a jury to wit: John H. Edwards, Henry B. Little, George Gardner, Levi Huntley, James A. Merrill, Benjamin Davies, William A. Jones, John B. North, Edwin Harrison, James Glend, and William Vick who being duly sworn and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oath returned a verdict to the following words to wit: "We the jury find the defendant guilty and apply his fine to one hundred dollars." Whereupon on the motion of the attorney for the Commonwealth a writ of Habeas Corpus is awarded against the defendant to be directed to the Sheriff of the County, commanding him to take the said defendant if he be found within his bail and bring safely keep so as to have him here on the first day of the next quarterly term to show if any thing he hath to say, why the Court should not then proceed to former judgment against him according to law.
