This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth order, adjudge and decree that James Cunningham appointed by former decree be and he is hereby authorized to sell with the sale all the land therein adjoining supposed to be about one hundred acres and that he report to the Court in order to a final decree.

On motion of Jeremiah Cobb Surrogate of Rockhill Court Ordered that the order made at December Court 1864 restraining the Sheriff from paying Rockhill & Cobb the sum of \$500 part of the money levied at June Court 1864 for building the Court house of this County be, and the same is hereby rescinded. And that the Sheriff in whose hands the said amount was restrained pay the same to the said Jeremiah Cobb as Surrogate of Rockhill & Cobb.
