On motion of Jeremiah Cobb surviving partner of Rochelle & Cobb Ordered that the order made at December Court 1854 restraining the Sheriff from paying Rochelle & Cobb the sum of \$500 part of the money levied at June Court 1854 for building of the Court house of this County be, and the same is hereby rescinded, and that the Sheriff in whose hands the said amount was restrained pay the same to the said Jeremiah Cobb as surviving partner of Rochelle & Cobb.
