Woodward, his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs and a certificate is granted him for returning letters of administration de bonis non in the estate of William H. Parker dec'd late a lieutenant in the United States Army - according to Law.

Smith and William Wardlaw his securities upon the said appeal, the amount thereof, together with ten percent per annum damages thereon from the aforesaid 16th day of September 1864 till paid and his costs by him about his defence in this behalf expended -

Ordered that Tom a negro slave belonging to John F. Blount do be placed upon the poor list and be provided for by the Deacons of the poor according to Law.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
