Edmonds his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Elbert Morrell in the sum of One hundred dollars and the said David Barnes Lewis Morrell, Benjamin Barnett and J. Edmonds in the sum of twenty five dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands & tenements to be bound and to the said Commonwealth to be vendible. Yet upon this condition that if the said Elbert Morrell shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens more especially towards the said John Morrell his wife for the term of twelve months from this day then the recognizance to be said or due to remain in full force.

And that they make report to this Court of their proceedings hereinafter in order to a final decree.
