The defendants Henry Williamson, Matthew Bentler and Charlotte his wife James E. and Martha his wife, Shirley, Thomas, James and James D. Pace, Biddy, Isab. Charlotte, Sarah J. and Nancy Porter who are out of this Country and against whom the plaintiff appears to have process in the mode prescribed by law against whom defendants still failing and answers in writing of the plaintiff by counsel shall make their bill for confessed as to those defendants and the cause coming on to be tried as to the other defendants in the bill, their answers and exhibits may be argued by counsel. On consideration whereby the Court doth adjudge order and decree that Edwards Pace who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, after advertising the time and place of sale for one month in advertisement at the Courthouse door or some Court day and at two or more places in the neighborhood of land. Sell to the highest bidder at Jersolom on some Court day, or in case of twelve months (except such sufficient to defray the expence of the sale and of the said) the land of which Farrell Turner died, deceased, lying in the County of Southampton containing four hundred acres more or less, and that the said Commissioner take bond and security of the purchaser, make him a deed and report his proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Joseph Briggs and John R. Briggs who made oath and together with William Briggs, Edwin White and Joseph Parker their sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs that a certificate is granted them for drawing letters of administration on the estate of William Briggs deceased in due form.

Ordered that William St. Nicholas, William G. Schell, Sipr Little, Henry M. Pitts and Henry P. Briggs or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of William Briggs deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

William Briggs is appointed Commissioner of the estate of Peggy Washington a person by reason of infirmity and therefore the said William Briggs and Joseph Briggs and John R. Briggs his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of thousand and fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs.

Ordered that Master Commissioner shall examine Estate and settle an account of William Briggs as Committee of Peggy Washington and make report thereof to Court.
