The defendants Henry Williams, Nathan Smith and Charlotte his wife James Smith and Mathias his wife, Henry Thomas, James and James J. Davis, Betty, Earl, Charlotte, Jacob J. and Henry Porter who are out of this County and against whom the plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the mode provided by law against absent defendants still failing, and answer on motion of the plaintiff by counsel the Court doth take them into bill for confessed as to these defendants And the cause coming on to be heard as to the other defendants on the bill, their answers and exhibits was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that Edwards Smith who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, after advertising the time and place of sale for one month by advertisement at the Court house door on some Court day and at two or more places in the neighborhood of land. Sell to the highest bidder at Auction on some Court day, an or parcel of timber land (except such sufficient to defray the expenses of the sale and of this suit) the land of which Farrell Turner died seized, lying in the County of Southampton containing four hundred acres more or less. and that the said Commissioner take bond and security of the purchaser, make him a deed and report his proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Joseph Briggs and John R. Briggs who made oath and together with William Briggs, Edwin White and Joseph Butler their sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs out of date as granted them for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Briggs deceased in due form

Or decreed that William St Nicholas, William J. Seball, John Little, Henry M. White and Henry P. Briggs or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do approve all the personal estate of William Briggs deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

William Briggs is appointed Commissioner of the estate of Peggy Washington a person of unsound mind and thereupon the said William Briggs with Joseph Briggs and John R. Briggs his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs.

Or decreed that Master Commissioner Bolt examine state and settle an account of William Briggs as Commissioner of Peggy Washington and make report thereof to Court.
