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The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report in these words to wit "We the undersigned Commissioners, who were appointed agreeable to the above order to divide the lands of which Benjamin Turner died seized, and all one third in valuation to Elizabeth Turner widow of Benjamin Turner decd. and on the premises on this day and have agreed by marks and bounds to Elizabeth P. Turner widow of Benjamin Turner decd. one third part of the land in valuation to be held by her for life in the lands of her deceased husband and bounded as follows. Beginning at the branch on the road near Marks A James' house stands down the said branch to a large corner opposite thence a boundary dividing to Nathan W. Thomas' line thence along his line up to the next road thence along said road till the first station House under our hands and date this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 18 hundred and forty four (Four 36 acres) All of which is accurately described".

Ordered that the account of Joseph J. Powell amounting to Seven dollars and thirty five cents be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

By reason of practice this cause came on this day to be heard in the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel upon the hearing of which the Court doth adjudge, order and direct that James G. Bryant, John Moore and Robert Murray be appointed Commissioners by this Court, any two of whom may act under this decree, that they agree to Elizabeth Williams one third of lands in value together with one third of the slaves and other personal property whereof James G. Williams died seized and professeth the land and slaves to be held by the said Elizabeth Williams during her life, the other property no less than they then divide the remainder of the estate both real and personal into four equal parts and if the said division cannot be effected without that they sell as many of the slaves as may be necessary for that purpose and agree one fourth to Catharine J. Williams one fourth to Penelope J. Williams, one fourth to Edwin A. Williams and one fourth to Eliza J. Williams after having paid the costs of this decree. And that the Commissioners make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that A. J. H. Burge, Robert Dots, Richard H. Daniels and Arthur H. Bell  
name or any three of them be let to the town and stated the repair or rebuilding of the middle  
Market bridge - receive the same when completed and make report to the Court.

On the motion of John H. Hall against Oliver Davis. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant hath legal notice of this action he was distinctly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant for twelve dollars and thirty cents with interest from the 15 January 1826 till paid also the sum of \$1.50 more or being the amount of a judgment obtained against the defendant before a Magistrate which was returned to the Clerks Office of this County to
