The Commissioners in this cause this day reads their report in these words to wit "We the undersigned commissioners who are appointed agreeable to the above order to divide the lands of which Benjamin Turner died seized, and all or third or valentines to Elyzabeth Turner widow of Benjamin Turner do not on the premises on this day and have assigned by marks and bounds to Elyzabeth D. Turner widow of Benjamin Turner dec'd one third part of the land an valentines to be held by her for life on the lands of her deceased husband, and bounded as follows Beginning at the branch on the road near Mark A. James' house, thence down the said branch to a large corner cypress, thence a southerly direction to Nathan W. Turner's line, thence along his line up to the river road, thence along said road to the first station, cross under new bridge and back this 8th day of October 18th hundred and forty four. (Dover 216 acres) All of which is perfectly described."

Ordered that the account of Stephen J. Powell amounting to seven dollars and thirty four cents be certified to the Auditor of public accounts for his communication and payment.

By consent of parties this cause came on this day to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by counsel. Upon the hearing of which the Court doth adjudge, order and direct that James D. Wingate, John Moss and Robert Murray be appointed Commissioners by this Court, any two of whom may act under this decree, that they assign to Elyzabeth Williams one third of lands in value together with one third of the slaves and other personal property whereof James C. Williams died seized and possessed the land and slaves to be held by the said Elyzabeth Williams during her life, the other property in fee, that they then divide the remainder of the estate both real and personal into four equal parts, and if the said division cannot be effected without that they sell as many of the slaves as may be necessary for that purpose, and assign one fourth to Catherine J. Williams one fourth to Poulpke J. Williams, one fourth to Edwin A. Williams and one fourth to Elyza J. Williams after having paid the costs of this decree. And that the Commissioners make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that A. J. H. Penque, John de Dols, Richard H. Daniels and Arthur W. Williams or any three of them do let to the land and take the repairs or rebuilding of the mill the decedent's day - receive the same when completed and make report to the Court.

On the motion of John H. Hill against Edwin Turner. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant hath legal notice of this motion he was lawfully called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant for twelve dollars and thirty cents with interest from the 15 January 1836 till paid, also the sum of \$150 with interest being the amount of a judgment obtained against the defendant before a Magistrate, which was returned to the Clerk of the County 1836.
