Tompson & Co. and James S. P. present, any three of whom may act, be appointed

Porter and the remaining eighth share of his deceased daughter Mary Porter
and report their proceedings to Court. If the said slaves cannot be divided in kind the

purpose, after giving twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, by advertisement
