 point, thence by Mr. Thomas Vaughan to intersect to be going roads at a point
 fence, supposed to be not more than two or two and a half miles. We are of opinion that it will
 be of great public benefit as it will shorten the distance from Monroe to Franklin as by
 there 2 1/2 or 3 miles and would be the most direct road from Monroe to Suffolk and
 Poole. We are also of opinion that it would be of no inconvenience to any individuals as
 evidenced by the fact (as we have been assured by Mr. Vaughan) that all the land
 owners are willing to relinquish all their claims for damages. We are assured by Mr.
 Vaughan that should the Court grant the order to open it shall not cost the County
 more than one hundred dollars. Given under our hands and seals this 17th November

 consideration thereof it is considered by the Court that the said order be granted.
