Motion of Peter M. Jackson option of taking jurisdiction w^tth the application
of the Court to the case of John H. Kirby for his bondman and the
Court sat upon the said Party between the said Plaintiff & Plaintiff aforesaid
said Plaintiff whereupon the said John H. Kirby together with George
H. Barber and Sampson & Lewis his counsels entered into and acknowledged
at least in the penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned as the Court
directed.

On Motion of John H. Kirby setting forth that he is bound in
the Court as security for Nathaniel J. Williams for his bondmanship of James
H. Dinswoy aforesaid of Joseph Griswold &c and that he concurred
to be in danger of suffering damage by reason thereof before going into the
Court for relief it is Ordered that the said Williams be summoned to
appear to show cause why he should not be ruled to give the said Kirby
good Counter security according to Law Disregarding the said Williams
appearance by his Attorney and referred to for the County aforesaid
it is Ordered that he doth and gives a Bondman aforesaid be recorded and
announced and that the said Williams pay the said Kirby his costs
in this behalf expended.

Anthony M. Howell @ Constable in the County appeared in Court and
refused any longer to discharge the duties of his Office and the Court passing
to elect @ constable to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of
Howell took the vote wherein and resulted as follows to wit:

On Motion of James Myrick Ordered that Thos B. Howell
Alexander Myrick and Israel Bassett @ who are hereby appointed
special Commissioners for the purpose to take with and report an
account of said Myrick administration on the estate of John Howell
the same to be paid along to court

Ordered that the Court be adjourned on the first day of the next Term
