

Ordered that he pay over and deliver as Guardian of the estate of said John M. Lusk, his estate by him in the behalf represented.

Arthur M. Webster, nephew of John M. Webster, do with the appearance of the Court, make choice of John M. Lusk, for his Guardian and the Court doth assign the said Lusk, Guardian to George Webster, nephew of said John Webster, whereupon the said John M. Lusk, together with George M. Barker and Sampson & Co. his securities, entered into and acknowledged at Court in the penalty of two thousand dollars, conditioned as the Court doth.

On Motion of John M. Lusk, setting forth that he is bound on the Court as security for Nathaniel W. Williams for his Guardianship of Estate. He praying relief of Joseph Dwyer, etc. and that his common law duty to be in danger of suffering damage by reason thereof, praying the Court for relief. It is Ordered that the said Williams be summoned to appear to show cause why he should not be called to give the said Lusk good Counter security according to Law. Whereupon the said Williams appeared by his Attorney and refused to give the security aforesaid. It is Ordered that he deliver and pay over as Guardian of the estate of said John M. Lusk, his estate by him in the behalf represented.

Anthony M. Howell, a Constable in the County, appeared in Court and requested any longer to discharge the duties of his Office, and the Court granting to elect a Constable to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of Mr. Howell, took the vote thereon and matters as follows to wit:

For William M. Foster the vote was Benjamin & Pepp. For David Thomas B. Dwyer, Edwin B. Glady, Alexander Myrick and Wm. Webster. For Griffon the vote was Saml. Dwyer, Robert L. Griffon and William Dwyer and William Webster having a majority of the vote are declared duly elected. It is appearing to the Court that the said Foster is a man of family, property and good character.

On Motion of James Knight Ordered that Thomas B. Dwyer, Alexander Myrick and Samuel B. Dwyer be and they are hereby appointed Special Commissioners for the purpose to take and set out an account of said Joseph's administration on the estate of John M. Lusk, etc. and make Report thereof to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term. The Minutes of the proceedings of the day were signed by Thos. Myrick.
