Mr. Commissioner in the Court the day ninth this Report in the
following words to wit: "I hereby to a court of the County Court of
Southampton County, Province of Virginia, Do the following act:
Certificates required in said above in reference to the signature which
have presented to value the sum of Matthew Vick and which relation
Amount to one thousand four hundred and fifty dollars provided
we have deducted four hundred and fifty dollars being that amount
due said Matthew Vick children from time so late as appears
by the last account made up to December 31st 1845 by William

Shank Commissioner which sum one thousand four hundred and fifty dollars
out of which we have apportioned to the Peter Vick (Doctor) and
as his son for life the following slaves to wit, William they collectively
valued at three hundred and fifty dollars and by such valuation
one hundred and thirty five dollars do find it to be impossibly
to settle the balance of said slaves equal in valuation between the children
of said Matthew Vick. Do therefore in that case directed by the court
afforded to the said Peter Vick on Monday the 19th Inst at public
market or at market of New Market the time carrying interest from the
day of sale they were purchased as follows:

five cents each being their proportion of the balance due on the former
account of services including interest to the day and have been
refunding back for the same back payable to Thomas D. Vick and
said Matthew Vick we have also paid to said Mary A. Vick and Eliza
Pope in right of her wife as aforesaid the sum of one hundred and
twenty five dollars and fifty cents each being their full share of the
sum of the balance of the value of the slaves apportioned and left also
thereby remaining back payable to Thomas D. Vick and
aforesaid for the same the balance say the hundred and fifty
dollars and twenty five cents belonging to Sally C. Ann E. and
Vick all of whom are under age and having no guardian or law
