On Motion of Warren P. Peppel ordered that John C. Clark and James B. Wren who are duly appointed special Commissioners for the purpose to take State sick and adjust an account of said Peppel's administration on the estate of Catherine Steiner and make Report thereof to court.

On Motion of John Vick ordered that out of the Commissioners of the Court examining State sick and adjust an account of said Vick's guardianship of the orphans of Edwin Vick add and make Report thereof to court.

Ordered that John Vick be except from the payment of fees for his Report &c &c and Sccrt in future being kept and infant.

Ordered that an inspector of fish be established for the County of Southampton and that the fee of inspecting be set forth by Law that a six cents per bushel and that an additional charge of two cents per bushel be allowed for specking and capering to be paid by the owner of the fish. Whereupon G. Clark Williams was appointed inspector and charged to take the rate required by Law.
