

S 15 W 46 p. along a line of marked trees on a small branch to a corner of the tract on New Hol-  
 lands line thence N 46 W 23 p. along a line between this tract and other Holland's to a dead oak  
 thence N 29 W 40 p. to a dogwood near the 36 gang road in Saml Marples line thence N 63 W  
 29 p. along a line of marked trees on the road side to a cotton stump near a persons new tree bush  
 thence N 32 W 32 p. to the beginning. In adding the above we have reserved the purchase of the  
 above lands the free use and benefit of the large ditch which run through the same and the privi-  
 lege of keeping it open to him his heirs and assigns forever. We have subjected the same to the above  
 as it is a sound and benefit and advantage to each part and parcel thereof and as the above two tracts  
 would not be equal without the privilege and advantage above mentioned. All of which is respect-  
 fully submitted. Given under our hands and seals this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of 1824. We thought it best  
 to have it surveyed and therefore had it done by Est N Marples and ascertain the quantity before  
 mentioned. This done. J. D. Hapburn, W. D. Smith. And this day the same was or to be  
 again heard by consent of parties and the agent of the Court on the paper formerly made in the cause  
 and was argued by counsel. We considered whereby it appearing to the Court that there was other  
 debt existing against the estate of Samuel R Gardner dec<sup>d</sup> which had the said estate of said  
 Gardner for the payment of which no provision is made in the same in the court record at Jan-  
 uary Court 1824. the Court doth adjudge order and decree that James W Marples the Special Com-  
 missioner appointed in said last named cause give public notice for at least two months at the  
 Courthouse door requiring all persons holding claims against the estate of said Samuel R  
 Gardner, which bind the real estate to produce them at an appointed time and place next  
 ensuing. And the Court doth further order and decree that the said Commissioner report the  
 same to Court together with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself to be so stated.

The Court doth appoint Henry Goodard, Elisha Ellsworth & John C Reed overseers of the poor in  
 the lower district of P. Dukes Parish;  
 James Dixon, Mark J Debo and William A Jones overseers of the poor in the upper district  
 of P. Dukes Parish.  
 John S Bailey, Alfred Stephenson & Willis Bradsheaw overseers of the poor in the upper district of  
 Northway Parish &  
 James Adams, William Edwards & Miles Lawrence overseers of the poor in the lower district  
 of Northway Parish in this County for the next ensuing three years. And it is ordered that  
 they be sworn in at the next Court to qualify.
