

S 15 N 76° E along a line of marked trees, in a small bend to a corner of the tract in other Hol-  
lands line above it by N 23° E along a line between this tract and other Hollands to a dead end  
thence N 32° W 32° E to the beginning. In settling the same we have reserved the privilege of the  
slaves that is the freedom and benefit of the large ditch which runs through the same and the pri-  
vilege of keeping it open to turn his horses and wagons over. We have subjected the slaves to the above  
as it is a mutual benefit and advantage to each party and general service, and as the other his slaves  
would not be bound without the privilege and advantage above mentioned. All of which is right-  
fully submitted. Given under our hands and seals this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 1846. We thought it best  
to have it surveyed and therefore had it done by Col H Murphy and ascertain the quantity to be as before  
mentioned 224 acres. I D Mapenburg. A J Smith. And this day the same came to be  
agreed and signed by counsel and the agent of the Court on the part of the party named in the cause  
and was agreed by counsel. We consider also whereof it appearing to the Court that there are other  
suits existing against the estate of Samuel R Gardiner deceased which held the land estate of said  
Gardiner for the payment of which no provision is made in the same in the cause resounding at Jan-  
uary Court 1846, the Court doth adjudge order and decree that James W Murphy the Special Com-  
missioner appointed in said last named suit give public notice for at least two months at the  
Court house door requiring all persons holding claims against the estate of said Samuel R  
Gardiner, which held the real estate to present them at an appointed time and place with  
evidence, and the Court doth further order and decree that the said Commissioner retain the  
sums to Court together with any moneys specially stated deemed pertinent by himself to be so stated.

The Court doth appoint Henry Loudon, Delah Ellsworth & John E Brule overseers of the poor in  
the lower district of P. Duke's parish,  
James Birney, Mark J Hale and William A Jones overseers of the poor in the upper district  
of P. Duke's parish.  
John J Bailey, Alfred Stephenson & Willis Bradshaw overseers of the poor in the upper district of  
Nottoway parish.  
James Adams, Silas and Edwards & Willis Lawrence overseers of the poor in the lower district  
of Nottoway parish in the County for the next ensuing three years. And it is ordered that  
they be summoned to the next Court to qualify.
