The Commissioners in this cause this day render their report which is in these words to wit  
"We the undersigned Assessors by virtue of the above decree have made sale of the said land and  
Willms Stephenson became the Purchaser for the sum of three hundred & one dollars & twenty  
five cents - after deducting Twenty seven dollars and forty three cents, the costs attending the  
said sale, have taken two bonds of equal amount for the balance & have agreed the said  
bonds to Willms Stephenson guardian of Hartwell and Polly Johnson. Which we  
respectfully subscribe. Allen Edwards, Wm. G. Stephenson, A. J. Stephenson"

Ordered that George A. Watson and Spratley Williams do let to the least vehicle  
representing the court house and informed the same - receive the same when completed and make  
report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the first day of April  
to take into consideration the propriety of suspending with the temporary bridge.

The Commissioners appointed to view and report the propriety of extending the embankment and  
erecting new bridge on the west side of the Halloway River near Somerville this day made their  
report. Whereupon it is ordered that Henry B. Vaughan, James W. Parker, G. A. Watson  
Benjamin Drury and Willms G. Godfrey any three of whom may act do let to the least  
undertaker the extension of the embankment and the erection of any such additional  
bridge as they may deem necessary - receive the same when completed and make report  
thereof to Court.

The account of Septimus P. Powell amounting to Seven dollars and thirty five cents is ordered  
to be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.
