The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report which is in these words to wit:
"We the undersigned being by virtue of the above decess have made sale of the said land and William Stephenson being the purchaser for the sum of three hundred and one dollars & twenty five cents - after deducting twenty seven dollars and forty three cents, the costs attending the said sale, have taken two bonds of equal amount for the balance of four dollars & eighty two cents to William Stephenson guardian of Hartwell and Polly Johnson. Whereof respectfully Submits Messrs Edwards Wm B Stephenson, A. J. Stephenson"

Ordered that George A. W. Johnson and Spradley Williams do let to the best advantage ^{regarding} the ^{report} of the Court house and superintend the same - receive the same when completed and make report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that the Sheriff Summons all the acting Justices of this County to the first day of the next Term to take into consideration the propriety of dispensing with the Lynchburg bridge.

The Commissioners appointed to view and report the propriety of extending the embankment and erecting new bridges on the west side of the Shallow River near Jerusalem this day made their report. Therefore it is ordered that Henry B. Vaughan, James W. Parker, G. A. Johnson, Benjamin Dewey and William J. Goudy, any three of whom away out, do let to the best advantage the extension of the embankment and the erection of any such additional bridges as they may deem necessary - receive the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

The account of Septimus P. Dwell amounting to seven dollars and thirty five cents is ordered to be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.
