James H. Parsons is appointed Surveyor of the road from the flat swamp bridge to the forks of the road near Hawk Harris in the town of Benjamin's Hill road. And it is ordered that the usual bounds do work thereon.

Henry Hurdock, Ichabod Ellsworth, John C. Beale, William A. Jones, John H. Hurdock, John L. Hurdock, Miles Woodshaw, James Holmes, William Edwards, Miles H. Hurdock, & Mark T. Putt appeared in Court and qualified as Dorsors of the poor of this County according to law.

James D. Hurdock is excused from serving as Dorsor of the poor of this County and William A. Worrell is appointed in his stead. whereupon the said Worrell appeared in Court and qualified according to law.

John Putnam aged about twenty seven years, a native of Great Britain who had been 7 rated into this Commonwealth, this day made oath that it was his intention to reside therein, and having taken the oath for giving up of fidelity to the Commonwealth, he is admitted to certain rights and Privileges granted to others upon their taking the said oath.
