 son of Henry Warren, four negroes to Thomas Hobk according to law. the said Hobk
 to pay seven dollars annually for the services of said Dab.

Ordered that Thomas D. Worrell Samuel D. Richardson Henry Blow and

 of the Hocklode river at the bypass bridge.

James A. Parsons is appointed Surveyor of the road from the flat swamp bridge
 the forks of the road near Aunt Harris' in the room of Benjamin Ellis deceased
 and it is ordered that the usual bonds be work thereon.

Henry Standard, Caleb Ellsworth, John C. Peale, William A. Jones, Dr. R. M. May Jr.
 Fifelemon Miller Bradshaw, James Holmes, William Edwards, H. H. Lawrence &
 March T. Peale appeared in Court and qualified as Masters of the poor of this County
 according to law.

James Drury is excused from serving as Master of the poor of this County and
 William M. Everett is appointed in his stead. whereupon the said Everett appeared
 in Court and qualified according to law.

John Webster aged about twenty seven years, a native of Great Britain who has been
 granted into this Commonwealth, this day made oath that he does not intend to
 reside therein, and having taken the oaths for giving assurance of fidelity to the
 Commonwealth, he is admitted to certain rights and privileges granted to him
 upon their taking the said oaths.

The Registers of Mary Jane Crocker & Nancy Evans, free negroes, were examined
 and certified to be truly made.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term
