Deed of trust from Albert S. Vellies to William D. Hood trustee for the benefit of Sally Vellies conveying land and personal property was returned and together with the certificate thereto annexed &c. having been admitted to record in the County Court of Surry admitted to record.

Deed of trust between Alexander Stewart of the first part, Jesse C. Bachman of the second part and Josiah Henry of the third part conveying personal property was acknowledged in the office and admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from William G. Goodwyn to George A. W. Newson conveying land was acknowledged in the office and admitted to record.

Deed of bargain & sale from Sally Powell to Jeremiah Williford conveying land was acknowledged in the office and admitted to record.

Court 1845 concerning the sale of the slaves belonging to the estate of Nathan Barnes dec^d for division, we have proceeded to sell on a credit of twelve months except such sufficient to pay the expenses of said sale and the sum of \$275.60 cents due Nathl. Francis the admor. of said Barnes in the commissioners report for the settlement of said estate and taken bonds in sums to correspond to the said sum due such legatee according to decree on demand twelve months after date from the 15th of July 1846. that being the day of sale of the following slaves -
